

"If we build it, they will come" is the misquoted line from the film 'Field of Dreams' but if we change it to the past tense it's certainly very true about Garvaghey, which continues to far exceed all our original usage projections.


During the first nine months of 2014/15, ie from November 2014 to July 2015, Garvaghey has catered for 45,000 users/visitors. Some 38.000 of them were Gaelic Games users of the Centre, representing a near-250% 'over-achievement' of the projected eventual annual total of 16,000 such users set out in our original Garvaghey plans.

The main groups using Garvaghey over those nine months have been:

- Tyrone GAA County team users (Seniors, Minors and Under 21s): 330 sessions involving 11.300 participants
- Tyrone LGFA County team users (Seniors and Minors): 84 sessions involving 2,440 participants
- Other Tyrone GAA users (Clubs, Acadamh Thír Eoghain, blitzes): 6,327
- Other Tyrone LGFA users (Clubs, underage, blitzes): 992

- GAA, LGFA and Camogie users from outside Tyrone: 8.128
- Schools users: 7,527 Other 'non-games' users (events,
- meetings, walkers): 6,867

At the same time 138 Tyrone GAA meetings involving 1.649 participants (1,245 men and 404 women) were hosted in Garvaghey. Our gender balance of users is about 71:29 men-to-women and the age balance is about 54:46



between Under and Over 18s. About 15% of users (some 6.800 people) are from outside NI.

2015 TYRONE SENIOR CHAMPIONSHIP

The footballers of Killyclogher St Mary's and Trillick St Macartan's will battle it out here today for the right to lift the O'Neill Cup and an entertaining game of football is anticipated from these two very evenly matched sides. Killyclogher won their sole Tyrone Senior Championship title back in 2003 by defeating Errigal Ciarán whilst Trillick have to go way back to 1986 for their last success at this level when they defeated Dungannon to claim their sixth and last title.

Trillick won their first ever Senior Championship crown way back in 1937 when they defeated Donaghmore but a team from that parish Kilskeery McDonagh's actually appeared in a final in 1916-17 when they lost out to Cookstown Brian Óg's. Killyclogher claimed Junior Football and Senior Hurling titles during the early years of their formation but had never appeared in a Senior Football Championship final until 1999 when they lost out to their neighbours Carrickmore.

Killyclogher's one and only title success came twelve years ago as they narrowly defeated Errigal Ciarán in the 2003 final. Several of those who won the O'Neill Cup on that occasion are still involved in the present set up with Dermot Carlin, Eoin Bradley, Leo Meenan, Niall McFadden, Mark O'Kane and Niall Bradley all playing members whilst Kieran Howe who played at centre half back on the breakthrough side for the St Mary's is now the team manager. Terry McCann was a veteran of the Killyclogher squad back in 2003



coming on as a late substitute for that famous win and he will no doubt be hoping that his two sons Tiernan and Conall can emulate his personal achievement following a long career by finishing up on today's winning side.

Whilst you wouldn't expect that any of the Trillick players from their last success in 1986 would still be playing then you'll be very surprised to learn that many of that great side will today look on with pride as their sons now go in search of O'Neill Cup glory. Mattie and Richie Donnelly are sons of Liam who proudly captained the team of 1986, Niall and Shane Gormlev are sons of Seamus, Niall Donnelly is a son of Sean. Daire Gallagher is a son of Iggy, Fergal Donnelly is a son of Gerard, Damien Kelly is a son of John and Keelan Kelly is a son of Gregory. Many others involved in the panel have strong connections to winning Trillick teams of the past and so maintaining the proud and strong history of the "Reds".

On their way to today's final Killyclogher have seen off the challenges of Errigal Ciarán, Strabane and Dromore whilst Trillick defeated Dungannon, Greencastle and Coalisland to secure their first final since 1987 when they lost out to Ardboe following a replay. Kieran Howe alongside John McElholm form the St Mary's management team whilst the St Macartan's will be led by Nigel Seaney, Stephen Kelly, Malachy McElholm and Brian O'Kane.

Many of the players involved here today have played side by side with Tyrone all season long with the Donnelly brothers Mattie and Richie (Trillick) and the McCann brothers Tiernan and Conall (Killyclogher) amongst those involved at Senior level whilst the Brennan brothers Rúairí and Lee and Rúairí Kelly from Trillick alongside Mark Bradley and Sean Fox of Killyclogher all played their part as Tyrone Under 21 footballers lifted the Ulster and All-Ireland titles.

Both clubs have had a very proud tradition of involvement within the GAA in Tyrone dating back to the birth of the association in the Red Hand County in 1904. Killyclogher and Trillick alongside the likes of Cookstown, Dungannon, Strabane, Donaghmore, Galbally, Clonoe and Omagh were amongst the early clubs after the formation of the first County Board in 1904 and they have certainly maintained a very strong presence in their local areas in many aspects of the Association.

They have also provided Tyrone with many fine players and administrators down through the years with both club grounds extensively developed to a very high standard which are a credit to all those now involved and indeed those who set out in the early 1900's with great hopes and aspirations and just couldn't have imagined that more than a century on that their legacy would still be evident. Whenever I think or talk about the GAA in Killyclogher and Trillick names that immediately spring to my mind includes the likes of Brendan Harkin, Donal Magee, Anthony Connolly, Seamus McDonald, John Coney, Noel McGinn, Vinny Owens, Terry McCann, Dominic McCaughey, Raymond Monteith, Dermot McCaughey, Liam Donnelly, Patsy McCaughey, Sean Donnelly, Michael McCaughey and Oliver McSorley.

SOME SEASON BUT WHAT NEXT?

In such a football mad county and with such a small number of hurling clubs one could be forgiven for seeing the hurling fraternity as a very small part of the bigger Tyrone picture. For those who follow the fortunes of the small ball game though you will be well aware that Tyrone Inter County hurling is in a more than healthy state.

After several successful seasons, Mattie Lennon has opted to step aside from the managerial hotseat. The Armagh native leaves Tyrone in a great position, his passion for the game was always evident. Lets hope that great work can continue.

In winning promotion with the Division 3B title of the Allianz League and Nicky Rackard Cup last year the success continued with a League 3A success this year and an extended run in the Cup again coupled with an appearance in the All-Ireland U21 C Final and a victory in the All-Ireland Minor C Competition.

Sadly, those in charge of the so called "lower tiers" of hurling felt the necessity for a promotion playoff and our seniors just missed out on what would have been a well earned and deserved step up to Division Two, but still what a Spring and early Summer we enjoyed.

The work rate and commitment shown by the gallant group of senior players under the guidance of Mattie Lennon and Dave Kennedy was evident from the start of the League campaign, they had bought into the gospel according to Lennon and it was paying dividends. Winning breeds winners they say and that was the mantra of Tyrone going into 2015 and life in Division 3A of the Allianz Hurling League.

It all started at Healy Park and a hard earned draw against Monaghan, the highlight, as was the case through much of the campaign, 1-7 from Damien Casey, there was also a debut for a new centre half back in the guise of Dermot Begley, he appeared in every game for the county this year. Next up was a trip to Fingal and a one point win followed by a great win over Fermanagh with Sean Og Grogans 3-3 a superb return for the Eire Og's man.

Damien Casey hit 0-11 against Louth in a 1-20 to 2-7 win before high drama against Roscommon, level on several occasions throughout, Sean Og found the net before Casey landed a mammoth free to seal the single point victory on a day when a win was required to secure a final berth. Casey finished that game with 0-10 and it was enough to see the young Dungannon man collect the Ulster GAA writers merit award winner for March.

The accountancy student certainly got his figures right with a stream of scores that kept Tyrone pressing for promotion as the Red Hands defeated Roscommon, Louth and Fermanagh. He rifled over 31 points in three matches during March, including one pointed free from 100 yards. Apart from his scoring and general play, Casey's leadership, as captain, stood out this year clearly defined in the final against Monaghan in the League final. Eventually Tyrone got over the line with Casey hitting 0-9 but valuable scoring contributions from the back Mark Winters, Grogan and Chris Cross as well as stout defending from Justin Kelly, Tiernan Morgan and Begley.

So silverware handed over to our captain by Martin McAviney but manager Lennon was far from impressed by the venue choice or indeed the fact there was no straight promotion. A play-off required against Donegal and it was off to Owenbeg. A thrilling contest ended all square 4-13 apiece. 2-8 from Casey and goals from Sean Og and Conor Grogan, indeed it was Donegal who were the happier to get out of jail.

The replay did not allow much time for recovery and in the end Tyrone just came up short, that brief heartbreak though was soon rubbed out at wet and cold Letterkenny as 1-7 from Damien Casey helped Tyrone to a much merited 1-12 to 0-11 win on the opening day of the Nicky Rackard Cup and so we were off again on the championship trail.

Carrickmore's Pairc Colmcille was in superb condition as we welcomed Armagh in the next round of the Rackard, sadly Tyrone conceded a couple of stunning goals and it was a different route required if the Cup was to be retained. Sadly it was all too much in the end. Week in, week out without rest took its toll back at Carrickmore as Roscommon put paid to a planned return to Croke Park to defend the Cup, winning the Semi Final clash by five points, but what a gallant bid by a weakened Tyrone.

Attention turned to the new look Under 21 series, a C grade for the Andrew O'Neill Cup, named after a great young East Tyrone hurler from Naomh Colmcille. Remarkably though there was no Ulster series this year for Tyrone so it was all hands on deck for this new competition. A 0-15 to 1-7 win over Fermanagh set up a semifinal outing against Louth, that game did not go ahead as the wee county pulled out leaving another trip to Derry and a meeting with Donegal, on an horrendous evening for hurling, it went to the wire with a lucky Donegal goal at the death sealing the title on the score 1-11 to 0-11.

The Tyrone GAA Health and Wellbeing Committee is currently engaged in a range of health promoting initiatives. Working closely with the club health and wellbeing officers, the committee has prioritised a number of key areas which affect all our clubs and communities.

A current example of this work is, Tyrone GAA's partnership with the Safeguarding Board for Northern Ireland (SBNI) to address E Safety matters and Social Media Concerns.

The Tyrone Health and Wellbeing Committee have organised a training event on E Safety/Keeping Safe on line and impacts of Social Media in our organisation, which will take place at Garvaghey on October 22nd at 7.30pm. This training has been arranged for all Health and Wellbeing Officers, Children's Officers and Chairpersons.

Following the success of the club officer workshop earlier in the year a second workshop specifically for club Health and Wellbeing officers will be held at Garvaghey on November 19th at 7.30pm. The County Health and Wellbeing committee want to ensure club officers have the necessary information and support to help make their roles as easy as possible. It promises to be a useful event!

Clubs are urged to ensure health and wellbeing is an important item on the Clár of club meetings. The County Committee are always keen to hear of any programmes or initiatives they have implemented in clubs, so they can help promote the great work that is being done already.

The promotion of physical activity in clubs and communities and the promotion of positive and healthy lifestyles is a priority.

Mental health promotion and suicide prevention are issues which continue to be a priority, and specialist training is available to local clubs.

The Health and Wellbeing Committee also implements the ASAP programme, which promotes the prevention of alcohol and substance misuse.

Information is available on where clubs can get advice/support on problems associated with gambling and other addictions, with signposting to where they can access cardiac response training and defibrillators.

Clubs are encouraged to promote the 'Live to Play' road safety initiative. In addition the Social Initiative has been reinvigorated, with the aim of improving health and wellbeing among older members of communities.

Tyrone Chairperson Roisin Jordan said: "In Tyrone we have a firm belief that there is a responsibility on us to look after our members in terms of mental health, physical health and general wellbeing. It doesn't mean we have to be experts on all these things, but it is a case of signposting and letting people know where they can get help. Our County Health and Wellbeing sub-committee, led by Fiona Teague, are doing great work in building their profile and I urge clubs to do likewise."

Health and Wellbeing Committee chairperson Fiona Teague added: "We are encouraging all clubs to put in place one initiative/ programme in their activities this year that will help promote positive health and wellbeing.

"This could be for current members or past members and the local community. It doesn't have to be a big event. Our clubs are at the heart of our communities and if we can use them to promote healthy messages we will health contribute to a healthier, happier society."

The Inter County season for the Tyrone ladies ended on the first weekend of August as Mavo eased to a comfortable win over our senior side in the first round of the qualifiers, Tyrone struggling to deal with a dominant performance from Mayo legend Cora Staunton. Our seniors, a team very much in transition, will perhaps be glad to see the end of 2015 with an eye on gearing up for next season but there are plenty of positives to take out of the season, but the evidence is clear, there is a lot of work still to be done.

The County Minors reached the Ulster Final while the Under 16s claimed the Ulster title in horrendous conditions at Donagh with a fine win over a fancied Monaghan side. The Under 14s had a difficult season, ending in an Ulster C final loss. That loss in a C final has perhaps defined the need for improved structures across the board. There is certainly an abundance of quality young footballers coming through the ranks but the difficult thing would appear to be bringing those players through to senior level.

The senior's national league campaign was a difficult one for both Tiffy Quinn and Tony McVeigh who stepped into the management breach. They suffered some heavy losses but secured Division 1 status with a decent performance and good win over Laois at Drumragh, a game heavily promoted and attended by a bumper crowd.

Staying in the top flight may though be a double edged sword, nice to be there but to what benefit? "Perhaps dropping down to the second division would not have been the end of the world" claimed Quinn, "You always want to win and be playing the best but relegation could have given this evolving squad some breathing space and allowed them to develop, they could well have been winning regular games and that breeds confidence".

Despite some poor results return there were some high spots in the campaign, with a number of formerly fringe players and new faces coming in to establish themselves as Senior County footballers. There were some decent performances too and while the championship ended with a loss to Mayo after an Ulster Semi-Final loss to Donegal, the performance against an emerging Cavan provided the small but loyal ladies following with something to smile about at Brewster Park.

While the minors were left disappointed at their Ulster final loss, winning Ulster was a wonderful achievement for the under 16s. The Ulster win, at wet and wild Donagh, over a very good Monaghan side was one of the year's real gems. Brian McGinn, Kevin Bogle and the management team developed a fine young side and many shone too in this years club senior championship and will be knocking on the Senior door next year. They were beaten in the end by a good Galway side in the All-Ireland Semi Final.

The Patrick Fahy and Co Solicitors club champions for 2015 are Errigal Ciaran, Glenelly and Trillick, each



of them through thrilling finals to annex the silverware.

Trillick, inspired by Fiona McCarney, eventually saw off one of the emerging forces Edendork in the Junior final to claim a first Ladies Championship for the "Reds". The senior final meanwhile attracted a massive crowd to Killyclogher.

Reigning champions St Macartans had accounted for Aodh Ruadh on route to a final outing with Errigal Ciaran who had edged out Carrickmore in a superb semi-final. What a thrilling final. Errigal looked home and hosed after Shannon Monaghan, Lyrecia Quinn and Maria Canavan all scored goals after their side turned in a wonderful defensive display. Late goals from Paula Donnelly and Chloe McCaffery left just a point between the team's at the end with Errigal crowned champions again for the first time since 2012.

It takes a lot of hard work, effort and planning to get to a Tyrone Senior Football Championship Final but sadly many clubs have never achieved such although I've no doubt that it's every players ambition to someday play in the showpiece decider and hopefully to go on and lift the coveted O'Neill Cup.

However even to get to this stage, there's one group of people without whom there would be no players or clubs contesting this decider or indeed any other games within the GAA for that matter and that's the good old referees whom we like to abuse, accuse and even question their parentage every now and again! Every game needs a referee and for the likes of today's Senior Final there will be a number of them involved in roles such as linesmen, fourth official and possibly even as umpires but the one person that stands out is the man or indeed possibly in this day and age maybe even the woman that will have the ultimate responsibility to make the game happen and if it goes wrong well he or she is usually the first person to blame and takes all the flak.

Much will have been written about the participants in today's final and indeed about teams of years gone by that either won or played in a County Final but little is ever mentioned about the referee so I've decided to take a look back at Tyrone Senior Championship Finals over the years and at some of the personalities involved. Just like the clubs aspiring to play in a County Final it's no doubt also every referee's wish that they would like to take charge of such a prestigious game but again like the players not all of them get to achieve such an honour.

The first ever Tyrone Senior Football Championship decider featuring Coalisland and Strabane was played away back in 1904 and was refereed by James Rice (Dungannon).

Down through the years several Tyrone County Board Chairpersons also have had the honour of taking charge of the finals with Fr James McManus (Kilskeerv), Fr James McGilligan (Carrickmore), Fr Thomas Kirke (Trillick), Fr Peter Hughes (Pomeroy) and the most recent was Cuthbert Donnelly (Aghaloo) in 1988 when he took charge of the clash between Omagh and Clonoe. I suppose that Cuthbert was the odd one out amongst the aforementioned as he wasn't a priest but I've no doubt that he was often referred to as "God" in Tyrone when he became

the handler of the coveted Sam Maguire Cup following the Red Hand's success in 2003, 05 and 08.

A look back at those who have officiated at the Tyrone Senior Championship Final shows that the great Paddy Devlin (Omagh) took charge of five deciders with the first being in 1960 when Clonoe defeated Donaghmore. His last final was some forty years ago as he was in the middle for the clash of Trillick and Owen Roes in 1975. Paddy no doubt leads the way but close behind him are Eamon Mullin (Ballygawley) and Michael Hughes (Donaghmore) who have both refereed four finals each. A number of others have refereed three finals including; Jackie Martin (Omagh), Olly Slane (Carrickmore & Beragh), Shane Corr (Coalisland), Jim Curran (Ardboe), Dessie Slater (Dungannon) and Martin Mohan (Eglish). The first person ever to referee three finals in a row was Patrick Gallagher (Omagh) from 1943-45.

Some other well known names that have taken charge of the premier competition deciders in Tyrone over the years include the likes of Mena Devlin (Derrylaughan), Jim Magee (Strabane), Billy Melly (Urney), Gerry McCabe (Clonoe), Jack Heaney (Beragh), Paddy Quinn (Killyclogher), Paddy Corrigan (Urney), Barney Taggart

(Clonoe), Leonard Duffy (Cookstown), Frank Campbell (Pomeroy), Donal O'Neill (Derrylaughan), Martin Sludden (Dromore), Stephen McNamee (Newtownstewart), John Kerlin (Clann na nGael), Kieran Kelly (Kildress), Sean Quinn (Brackaville), Martin Kolbohm (Rock), Cathal O'Hagan (Brackaville) and not forgetting last years man in the middle Sean Hurson (Galbally).

Eamon McHugh (Aghyaran) has taken charge of two finals to date, the first in 2010 and he was appointed once again in 2011 to take charge of the decider between Dromore and Clonoe but had to retire after just a few minutes owing to an injury only to be replaced by the standby official on the day Eugene McConnell (Clogher) for his first taste of action on the big stage at a Senior County final. You've often heard of players being substituted but rarely ever a referee!

Jerome McElroy (Aghaloo) today joins that elite list of officials that have taken charge of a Senior Championship final and I've no doubt that he will do an excellent job as he has steadily progressed through the ranks from a player to one of the top referees in Tyrone. He now joins his fellow clubman Cuthbert Donnelly on that illustrious roll of honour and I wish him well in his endeavours.

A number of those referees mentioned went on to take charge of many games at National and Provincial levels with Paddy Devlin still the only man from Tyrone to have the unique honour of taking charge of an All Ireland Senior Final when he was in the middle for the 1972 clash of Offaly and Kerry and again in 1974 for the meeting of Dublin and Galway Jack Heaney, Jackie Martin, Michael Hughes, Dessie Slater, Jim Curran, Martin Sludden, Cathal O'Hagan, Eamon McHugh and presently Sean Hurson are amongst just some of those dedicated officials that have gone on to take charge of major games outside Tyrone and I feel that it's long overdue that a second Tyrone referee was appointed to take charge of a Senior All-Ireland final.

Several officials from outside Tyrone have also taken charge of the Senior Championship decider in years gone by with a look through the records indicating that referees from Belfast, Armagh, Monaghan and Portadown all have had the honour of whistling at the top level. The last man from outside Tyrone to take charge of an O'Neill Cup decider was Patsy Lynn (Toome) who sadly passed away just recently, he was in the middle for the 1977 clash as Carrickmore defeated Dromore.

Please remember today and indeed always that the referee is only human like the rest of us and is out there doing their level best whilst also playing their part for their club. Where would we be without the good old referee, love them or loathe them - but there would be no games without them!

Tyrone Ladies keeper Shannon Lynch was joined by familiar names to anyone who follows the ladies game, Aine Canavan, Nicola Rafferty, Lisa Marie Skeffington and Shauneen Ferrity.

Mickey Harte, fresh from guiding Tyrone to a first All-Ireland, maybe had an eye on Ronan O'Neill, Barry Tierney and Conor McAliskey while club stars Conor McCreesh, Niall Sludden and Darragh McAnenly were also delighted to be selected from the Summer camps.

Two young lads selected that year will be making their county final debuts twelve years on. Killyclogher's Tiernan McCann and Trillick's Fergal Donnelly will need slightly bigger kits in 2015 from the ones in 2003 and it must have been a great day for the young Tiernan who would have supported his Father Terry in the senior final that same afternoon.

Several players including Leo Meenan, Dermot Carlin and Eoin Bradlev lined out in that County final and return under the man that played Centre Half Back in 2003. current Killyclogher man Kieran Howe and they link up with the "wee cub" from the half time game.
